





Author Mary Krugerud will be speaking about the Glen Lake Sanatorium. It was Minnesota's largest sanatorium and was torn down in 1992 to make way for the Glen Lake Golf course in Minnetonka. It served thousands of patients with then incurable tuberculosis from 1916 to 1976. Mary has been writing a book about all of the sanatoriums in Minnesota. Minnetonka Historical Society receives MNHS Legacy Grant

The Minnetonka Historical Society has received a grant from the Minnesota Historical Society with which we will begin the process of updating and organizing our archives. Our first steps will be to develop a comprehensive Collections Management and Procedures Policy, and to train volunteers to implement these policies. This essential museum tool will provide a framework for establishing responsibility for collections management on both the policy making level and daily implementation level.

This is the first phase of a four-part plan. Future phases will include inventory and cataloging, improving archival storage, and digitizing key records and photos for online access and research. The project is long-term but will ultimately benefit our organization through increased capacity to stage exhibitions, conduct research, and develop programs. And will benefit the broader history community through increased access to the objects and archival materials in the Minnetonka Historical Society collections and archives.


